SCHOOL GARDEN INITIATIVE NEWS FROM ERNEST GALLET



Ms. Hannah Leblanc's third grade class has been hard at work getting their garden ready for planting. In August we learned about garden safety and in September our lesson was 5 Things Needed for A Healthy Plant.

On September 25 we attended the School Garden Training Day at Charles Burke Elementary. The teachers and garden ambassadors learned about healthy soil, how to create a watering schedule for your garden, the effects of litter on our environment, and a healthy diet with "My Plate."

Our plants from Bonnie were delivered this week. Our tubs are clean and ready but we have a big problem. Our garden has been invaded by Brown Widow spiders! They are not native to our area. School gardeners check your garden! They like plastic and are under the lips of our garden tubs. They have a very distinctive egg sack and seem to be very aggressive and protective or their eggs. Dan called Dr. Ring at LSU and he advised using Bifenthrin, but it is not approved for use by the school board. We are awaiting their action. We may have to use an alternate location for our garden this Fall, and hopefully plant in our regular tubs in the spring. P.S. The school will be sprayed for the invading spiders!

WHAT PLANT AM I?

I'm a cool-season bushy annual, somewhat spiraling in growth, native to the Mediterranean. I was mentioned by Pliny the Elder as relief for melancholy. The Crusaders drank beverages with my flowers floating on top to give them courage. My leaves and stems are hairy. I can grow up to three feet tall and almost as wide. All of my parts are edible except my roots. My blue star-shaped flowers arch downward, and, when dried, are used in potpourri. They can also be candied or crystallized. I'm also used to make Pimm's Cup, with gin and liquors added. My leaves can be added to salads, cottage cheese, soups and egg dishes. I'm said to taste like fresh cucumbers.

I grow in poor sandy or clay soil in full sun to part shade. I self-seed readily, and can be invasive if not kept in check by pulling up babies that spring up voluntarily. Because of my long tap root, I don't transplant well. I am planted from September to February and bloom for many months. My seed pods resemble tiny footballs.

According to Amy at the (sorry) vomiting chicken website, my other uses include:

- 1.Cover crop. My long taproot pulls nutrients to the surface to enrich the soil when I'm tilled under.
- 2. Mulch. But remove seeds first.
- 3. Compost. Again, remove seeds first.
- 4. Companion plant with tomatoes, strawberries and squash. Some say I deter tomato hornworms.
- 5. Fertilizer. Cover leaves with water in a covered container and steep for two weeks. Strain and use one part liquid with nine parts water
- 6. Feed your chickens! Amy says her chickens love me and would smile if they had lips

Observations From Outside

Donald J. Hall Sculpture Park



The game of badminton is generally played on a grass court with rackets and small feathered game pieces called shuttlecocks that are held in the palm of your hand.

However, on the 22 acres of outside green space that makes up the Donald J. Hall Sculpture Park at the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art in Kansas City, Missouri, there are four shuttlecocks that weight 5,500 pounds apiece, and are 18 feet tall!

These artworks are part of the more than 30 sculptures and art installations that make up the park whose creators range from the classical, Rodin and Renoir, to the modern, Henry Moore, Alexander Calder and Claes Oldenburg.

The art is displayed on wide terraces of soft Kentucky Blue Grass and fescue that slope south for several city blocks and are flanked by Linden trees; or, nestled among massed Fall floral plantings of bronze/rust colored sedums, and bright red dragon wing begonias (begonia X hybrida).

The grounds and building that houses the museum of more than 40,000 works was donated by William Rockhill Nelson in 1933, the founder of the Kansas City Star newspaper. It is frequented by both international visitors as well as the citizens and families of the area-is much beloved and general admission is free!

LPMGA ELECTION TIMELINE

Please review the LPMGA Handbook for the responsibilities and requirements of the various Board positions. Please refer to the Lafayette Parish Master Gardeners Association Handbook (Bylaws section: page 3, Article VI, Section B, Nominations of the Officers and the Policies section: page 13, Member-At-Large Election)

- The Member-At-Large serves as ombudsman and liaison between the Board and the general membership. This person is selected independently be the general membership by ballot vote following nomination from the floor. Prior approval by candidates is required before names can be submitted for nomination.
- 2. Member-At-Large Election Timeline:
 - September newsletter: Call made for Member-At-Large candidates to be nominated at the October general meeting. Permission must be obtained prior to nomination. (From nominee.)
 - October General Meeting: Nominations from the general membership for Member-At-Large are made and members
 decide on the method of voting. Since only active members can vote, the recommendation is made that ballots with
 space for additional nominees would guarantee that only active members are voting.
 - November General Meeting: Election of the Member-At-Large is held at the same time as election of the other board members.
 - December General Meeting: Installation of officers, including Member-At-Large. All officers, including Member-At-Large, take office January 1.

PLEASE CHECK YOUR RECORDED HOURS FOR ACCURACY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

I recently received an email from our Louisiana Master Gardener State Coordinator stating that she had received a few emails from other Louisiana MG groups reporting that their recorded volunteer hours were not showing in the online recording system. This problem has effected a small amount of volunteers statewide, but please check your recorded hours for accuracy as soon as possible. The Volunteer Coordinator cannot tell if hours are missing from your account.

Please note that due to the LSU AgCenter closing for holiday break, the AgCenter deadline for recording 2019 hours is December 15th. You may record 2019 hours until December 31st, but will not have the benefit of tech support if there is a problem.

With regards to the lost hours issue, again, please check your recorded hours as soon as you can. Hours performed in 2019 can only be recorded in 2019, and no one wants to lose their hours.

MASTER GARDENER CLASS MEMBERS: Congratulations! Many of the 2019 Class have already achieved 40hrs. Remember that you have from the first day of your class to December 31st, 2019 AND from January 1st, 2020 to December 31st 2020 to achieve your goal. Hours performed in 2019 must be recorded in 2019, hours performed in 2020 must be recorded in 2020. The system does not allow us to add hours to previous years, only the current year.
